

Steve Sengstack To Head Education Foundation, Calanthia Tucker Elected President of Board

The Apple FCU Education Foundation Board selected a career educator to lead the organization that serves as the credit union's charitable arm. Steve Sengstack his new post July 1. His selection was announced by the Board following its meeting on February 23.

Sengstack was a teacher, counselor and administrator in Fairfax County Public Schools for 37 years. During his career he worked at Lake Braddock Secondary School, Robert E. Lee High School and Annandale High School. He served as an English teacher, a head football coach, a school counselor and a director of student services. He has also worked at George Mason University as a supervisor to English teacher interns. He holds a B.A. from Emory & Henry College and a M.Ed. from George Mason University

Sengstack replaces Thomas M. Engley who announced his intention to step down earlier this year. He will remain with the foundation in a limited role.

Apple FCU takes great pride in its legacy of charitable giving to the education community. The Foundation's programs have ambitious goals that include: helping more students go to college, accelerating the effectiveness of new teachers and recognizing and celebrating great teaching.

In other Foundation news, Dr. Calanthia Tucker, Board Chair of the Apple FCU Board of Directors, was recently elected President of the Board for the Apple FCU Education Foundation.

Dr. Tucker, a long-serving member of both boards, is a lifetime educator who completed her career in Fairfax County Public Schools (FCPS) as a cluster superintendent earning

the Point of Excellence award for superintendent leadership from Kappa Delta Pi fraternity.

Three new members have been appointed to the Foundation Board: Linda Burke, a FCPS associate superintendent; Carolyn Custard, the Director of Student Services at Prince William County Public Schools; and Crystal Jenkins, Apple FCU's Training and Development Assistant Manager.
